#### Gallery 1 Memory Theatres and Datalands Rachel MacFarlane, Artist-in-Residence Artist Presentation: Wednesday 27 Nov @ 12Noon

To preface the creation of her work as the Bill and Isabel Pope Artist-in-Residence, MacFarlane investigates ancient and renaissance spatial mnemonics, such as the Method of Loci and Giulio Camillo's *Memory Theatre*, and their affinity to contemporary methods of cataloguing information in order to explore the relationship of memory, space and image.



MacFarlane creates architectonic dioramas from found materials. The manufactured settings are transcribed into oil paintings and transformed into uncanny spacescapes. These painted spaces reference illusory media and draw the viewer into dense and maximalist avenues while also emphasizing their physical attributes as objects in space.

#### Gallery 2A The Gurkhaeum Mike Dowdall, undergraduate exhibitor Artist Presentation: Thursday 21 Nov @ 12Noon

About his exhibition of fictional mixed media works the artist states: "*The Gurkhaeum* contains a series of iconic images illustrating important scenes from the *Epic of Gurkha*: a mythical story that I have created from diverse sources. Through these mix media icons I am interested in making a myth of my own, with all the trappings, to depict the fantastical everyday elements I see at work constructing the environment around me."



#### Gallery 2B FutureNatural Najet Ghanai, undergraduate exhibitor Artist Presentation: Tuesday 19 Nov @ 12Noon

Sculpture major Najet Ghanai, presents a new series of work inspired by museology and folklore. Through the creation of fictional habitats made from salvaged and natural materials, observers are given the opportunity to interact with the piece. The work functions both as art and as a teaching tool, rooted in the artist's fascination with our current bizarre relationship to the natural world.



#### Gallery 3 Belt Heads François Morelli, Artist-in-Residence Artist Presentation: Wednesday 20 Nov @ 12Noon

Morelli's *Belt Heads* are accessories for the exploration of alternative realities. Made from old belts that once wrapped around waists, these 'masks' have fed Morelli's appetite for over fifteen years, allowing him the distance to pursue otherness and challenge structures of authority. With a glove inside the belt heads, Morelli draws holding brushes through their "mouths", telling a story of prosthetics where the oral becomes visual. His prints and drawings are highly decorative and build on the intricacies of interlaced patterning. Unapologetically laborious and crafty, they remind us of the phenomenological nature of perception and the iconic power of static images.
